

1. VOLLEYBALL YUKON DOPING POLICY

Volleyball Canada (VC) has implemented this policy for athletes that participate at the national or international level of competition. Athletes that participate at these levels will be subject to this doping policy that was adopted from the official rulebook of Volleyball Canada.

- 1.1. In accordance with the Canadian Policy on Penalties for Doping in Sport (CPPDS), the following banned and restricted substances and methods exist:
 - 1.1.1. BANNED SUBSTANCES: Stimulants, Narcotic Analgesics, Anabolic Agents, Diuretics, Peptide Hormones, Analogues and substances that alter the integrity of the urine samples.
 - 1.1.2. BANNED DOPING METHODS: Blood doping and pharmacological, chemical and physical manipulation of urine.
 - 1.1.3. RESTRICTED DRUGS: Injectable Local Anesthetics, Asthma and RespiratoryAilment Drugs, Corticosteroids, Caffeine, Beta Blockers, Alcohol and Marijuana.

These substances, together with examples of permitted substances are contained in the Canadian Center for Ethics in Sport's Drug Classification booklet.

- 1.2. In accordance with the CPPDS, the following penalties shall apply for those persons committing doping or doping-related infractions:
 - 1.2.1. Doping infractions.
 - 1.2.1.1. Sports eligibility for athletes:

1st infraction: 4 years ineligibility from all Volleyball Canada activities.

2nd infraction: life ineligibility from all Volleyball Canada activities.

1.2.1.2. Sports eligibility for non-athletes:

1st infraction: life ineligibility from all Volleyball Canada activities.

- 1.2.2. Doping-related infractions.
 - 1.2.2.1. Sports eligibility for athletes:

1st infraction: 4 years ineligibility from all Volleyball Canada activities.

2nd infraction: life ineligibility from all Volleyball Canada activities.



1.2.2.2. Sports eligibility for non-athletes:

1st infraction: life ineligibility from all Volleyball Canada activities.
